


First official screening of the "Unifour Children's Sight" screening project.





MARCH'S SHINING LION: JIM VOELBEL

Our own Lion Jim Voelbel is a committed volunteer with the Habitat for Humanity. He moved to the Hickory area in 2018. After the build of his home was complete and him and his wife had settled into the area, Jim was looking for a volunteer opportunity to keep him busy in his retirement.

Twice a week, Jim can be found on repair sites restoring decrepit and unsafe home conditions particularly in that of older homes. Much of the work they do includes work on gutters, skirting on trailers and doublewides, and most abundantly, building wheelchair ramps. Currently he is a part of a repair project on an older home located in Newton where they are rebuilding a rotted back deck and stairs.

Jim's passion for the people behind the homes restored is evident when you ask him to share what the true behind the scenes experience of Habitat for Humanity looks like. He shares that the living conditions of many are so horrific and that most clientele are on site when they are doing the repairs. The people of these homes are endlessly grateful in their expression for the services being provided to them. For some this is the first time that they are able to safely sit outside their home. Often clients will share cookies, sweet tea, or the like. In fact, Jim's introduction to the earmarked southern food of livermush took place by a kind-hearted client who offered to make sandwiches for the volunteers repairing his home.

Jim smiles with chuckles as he says the volunteers get paid in coffee and doughnuts, but that the true joy comes from improving the quality of life and safe living conditions for others; there is a great need. This year I attended RLLI (Regional Lions Leadership Institute) training this year and it was the best I have ever attended. The atmosphere was intimate with a small group of 25 over a long weekend of a Thursday through Sunday. During our time together we went over various topics.

Learn about the organization, build character, learn your strengths and weaknesses, how to work as a team, learn to support others and so much more. Long View Lions resumes hosting their annual chili cookoff post-COVID.






